She went for a walk in the forest.



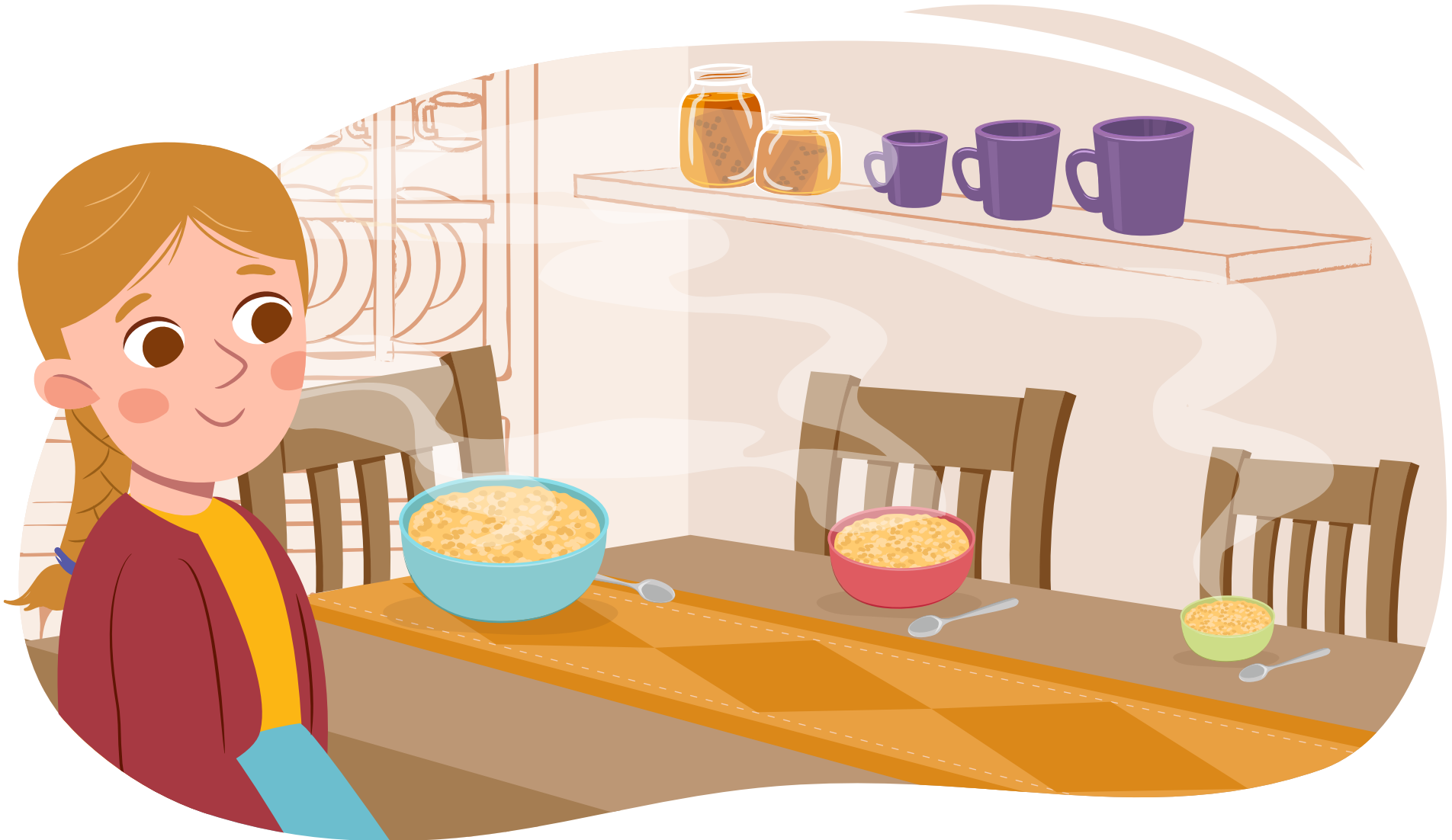
She saw a small house in a middle of the forest.
She knocked on the door, but no one answered.



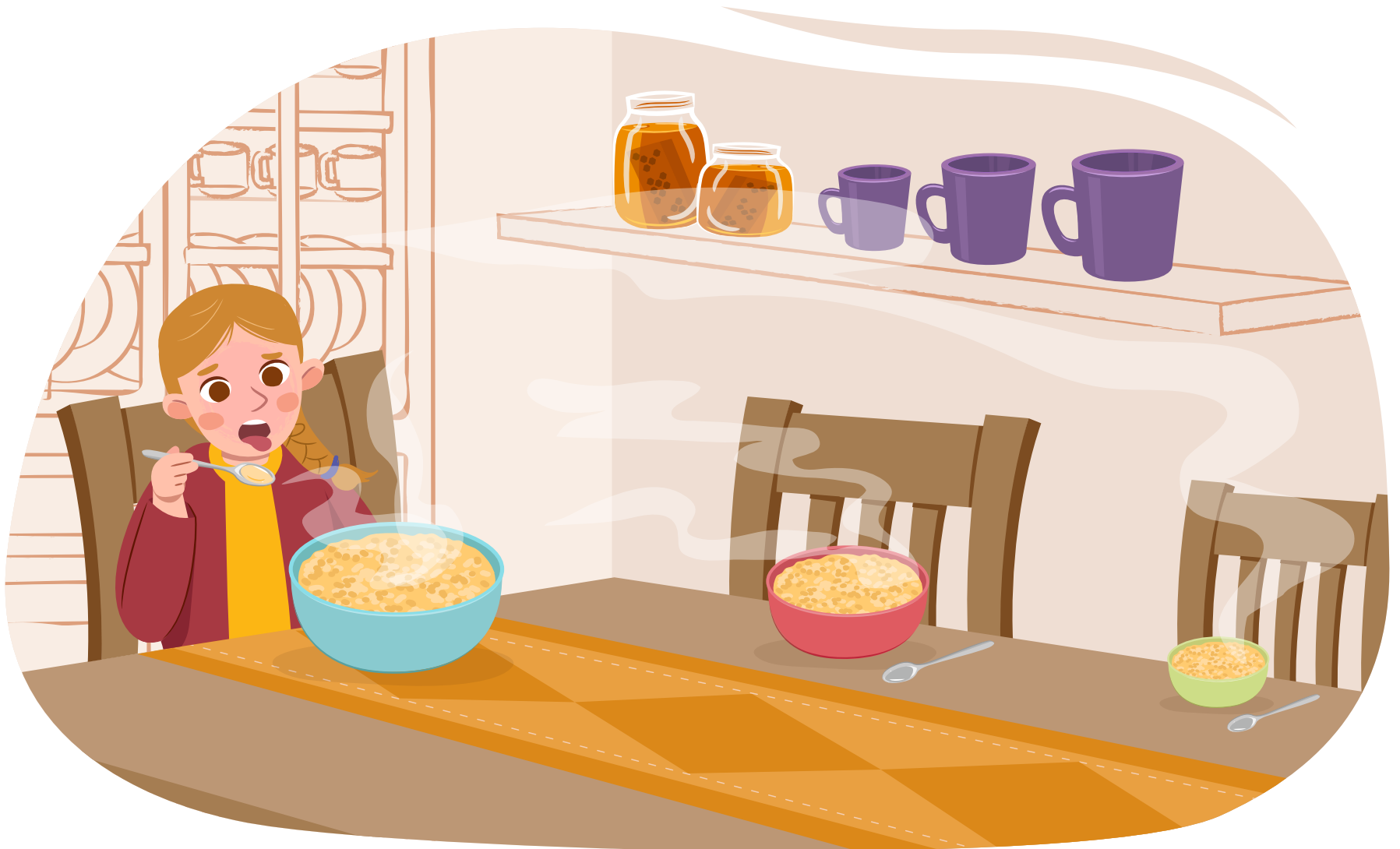
It was starting to rain so she went inside the house.

"Someone sat in my chair too," said Mama Bear.

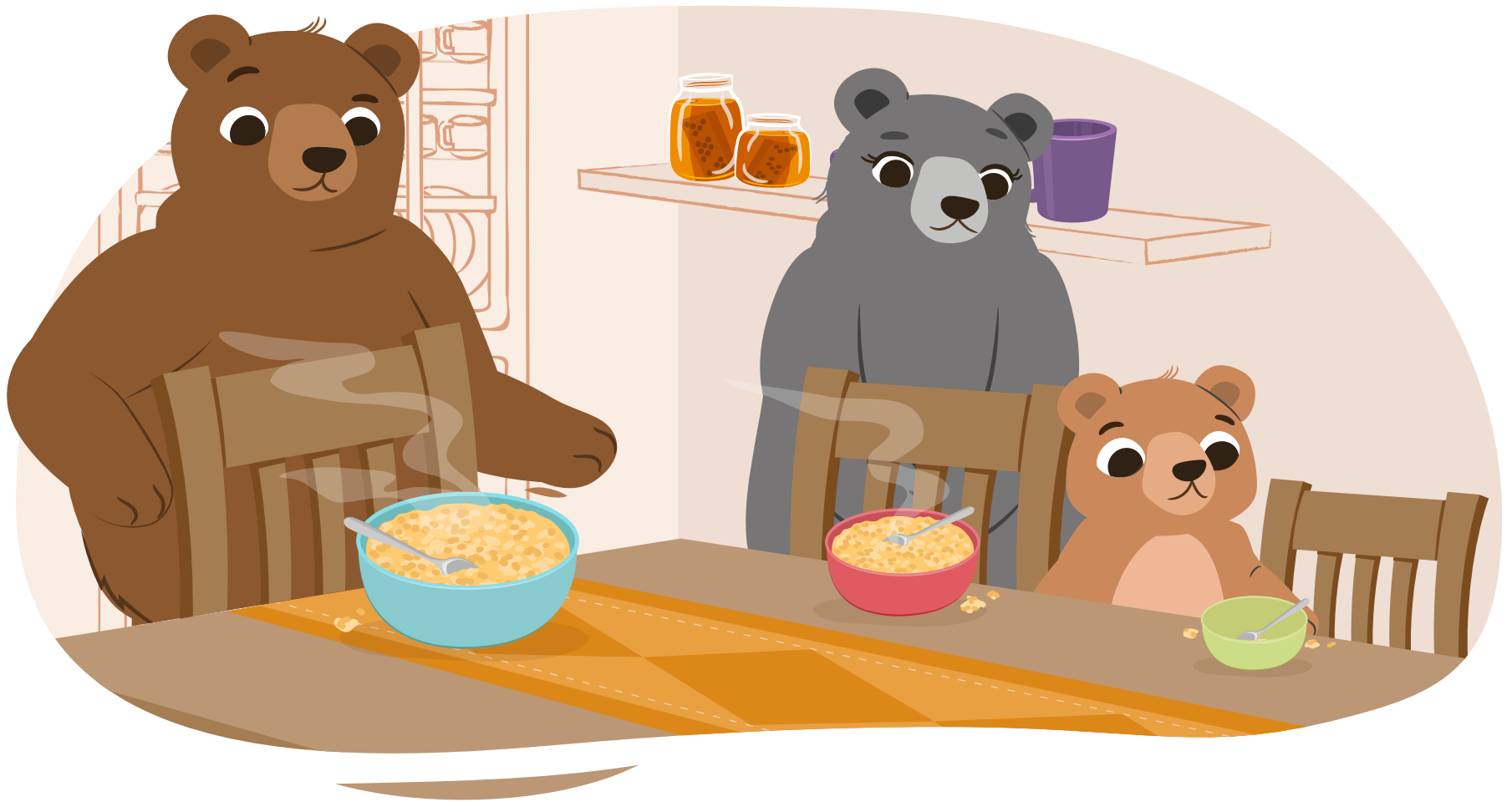
"Someone sat in my chair too," said Baby Bear.
