Questions	Possible Responses
1. Who are the characters in the story?	Possible response: The Three Sisters, a little Odawa boy
2. How does the use of music in the performance help to create mood?	Possible response: The music is smooth and soft. The volume stays the same throughout the story. It helps create a peaceful and calm mood.
3. This story reflects the roots of the traditional Oneida diet. How is experiencing the performance different from reading the information?	Possible response: While reading the information helps us to understand the traditional Oneida diet, experiencing the performance gives the audience a sense of time and place.
4. What was the setting of the story at the beginning? Did the setting change throughout the story? Why might each setting be important?	The story begins in a field where the Three Sisters live. Later in the story the setting changes to the Odawa boy's home where the sisters are reunited. This setting change is important because it answers the question, where do the sisters go?

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5. What style of visuals were used to enhance the story?	The visuals used in the performance are sketches created using a sepia tone (i.e. variations of brown). This gives the effect that the story is from long ago.
